# **Enrolling Now for Kindergarten 2017**

**Dear Parents, Students and Teachers** 

Kindergarten enrolments for 2017 are now open. If you have a child of school age or know of someone who does, please download a form from our website or visit the school office and ask for an enrolment form.

### Catholic Schools' Week

Thank you to all parents, carers and visitors to our school during Catholic Schools' Week. We understand how difficult it sometimes is for you find the time to come to such events, but both teachers and children were delighted to have you visit their spaces to celebrate the learning that happens on a daily basis.

#### **Afternoon Dismissal**

We are continuing to work with the police and local council, who visited our Kiss and Ride area again last Wednesday. As mentioned previously, they have asked that we improve the efficiency of our processes. Following on from our discussions we have:

- increased the number of teachers on duty in the bay;
- reminded children to sit in family groups and to listen carefully for their name;
- asked children to take their bags off their back ready to guickly enter your vehicle; &
- provided new family name cards for all vehicles.

We have also been told that we should ask for:

- signs to be left up on the dashboard until children enter the car (easier to identify)
- parents to leave and do another loop if their children are not ready for collection.

We would appreciate it if you could remind children of these expectations in order to promote a more efficient system. The expectation is that traffic will flow more quickly and that all children will be collected from this area by 3:30 pm. Could I please also remind parents to send a note to the class teacher if there is a change to normal pick-up routines.

#### **Year 6 T-Shirts**

We have been notified by our supplier that the company that produces the Year 6 shirts has accidentally produced too many size 12 shirts for our school. As a result we have an additional 50 size 12 shirts that we can offer for a price of \$15. # Crunch & Sip

<u>All</u> classes in our school have a Crunch and Sip break at approximately 10:00 am every morning. This is only a very short break, so could I please remind parents to provide:

- a bottle of water; and
- a small piece of fruit or a small quantity of cut-up fruit and/or vegetables as a snack.

#### **Teachers in Classrooms**

We have had some questions from parents about teachers who are in their child's class, so we would like to clarify this for all parents.

- Classroom teachers are entitled to 90 minutes of preparation time each week. During this time another teacher (the <u>same teacher across the year</u>) will continue to follow the designated teaching and learning program in your child's class.
- Co-ordinators (who are also classroom teachers) are entitled to release time to organize and lead in the area for which they are responsible. The amount of release time (from 2 hours up to 2 days) is based on whether they are a Co-ordinator 1, 2 or 3. Again, across the year the same release teacher will teach your child's class.
- As well as this, we have other teachers that work in the classroom at the same time as your child's teacher. These teachers work co-operatively with the classroom teacher to provide additional support for students.

# **Holy Week**

Next week, on Thursday 24th March, you are invited to join us as we come together to celebrate a very special time in the Church year - Holy Week. This celebration will take place in Area A at 9:15 am. Children will come to understand the events of Holy Week as they follow Jesus' passion – including Jesus' entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, the Washing of the Feet, the Last Supper and Prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane on Holy Thursday and Jesus' Crucifixion on Good Friday. When we return to school on Tuesday, 29th March, we will celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus during our morning asssembly.

In addition to this, all students will participate in a teacher-guided walk through the Stations of the Cross at school next week. Students in each class have been involved in creating a visual representation of a station and these will be displayed near the office building and staffroom. Parents are welcome to walk the stations when they are at the school.

Reading is crucial for children's literacy development, so this year we are again encouraging all children to become involved in the Premier's Reading Challenge.

# **Quality Catholic Schooling Survey**

All Catholic schools in the Diocese of Parramatta will be once again participating in the Quality Catholic Schooling (QCS) survey.

The QCS survey provides information from students, staff and parents about our school's cultural behaviour, relationships and learning community and assists us in our focus on continuous improvement.

Between 21 March and 1 April 2016 all staff, all Year 5 & 6 students and 60 randomly-selected parents will be asked to complete an online survey. Staff and students will complete the survey online at school. Parents will be sent home a paper survey but will also be able to complete the survey online if preferred. The survey will take about 20-30 minutes to complete.

This year we will again be able to get even more information about the link between student wellbeing and learning outcomes. To do this we will need to include a student identifier in the student survey. The survey will still remain confidential and individual survey responses will not be accessible by the school or the Catholic Education Office.

An independent survey consultant (Insight SRC) who manages the data collection will ensure the survey data is kept strictly confidential. Each school will receive a de-identified information report at the end of May to help them to develop strategies for further improvement. This will definitely help us in working with all students to improve their learning. If you have concerns, please feel free to contact the school.

As a parent, <u>if you are randomly-selected to complete the survey</u>, I would encourage your participation as this will help our school to identify our strengths and areas in which we can focus our improvement.

#### SISTER CATHERINE MADDOCK



We wish all our representatives the very best of luck at this next level of competition.



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
