Dear Parents, Students and Teachers

Welcome back to the new school year. I hope you all had a wonderful Christmas and a Happy New Year. Christmas is always a great time to connect with family and with our faith. 2016 will certainly be a year of change, as we welcome a number of new teachers to our staff and welcome especially our new Kindy families and other families new to our community.

The task that we have as parents and teachers cannot be underestimated. Last year we had great success in developing our literacy and numeracy skills across the school, but there is still work to be done. Our Leadership Team, along with all our teachers, have high expectations for our children in terms of their learning. This includes their creativity and social development. We acknowledge that our greatest successes occur when we encourage and nurture this development; when we inspire our children by making learning exciting and enjoyable. There are many other aspects that make a big difference to learning – being at school on time, consistent attendance, school readiness and organisation. The partnership that we establish between parents and teachers is central to this work and must be grounded in trust.

Yesterday I sent home a letter outlining some of the expectations for school readiness and safety. It is great to see all the children in their school uniforms and we do insist on standard haircuts. A significant safety consideration is our dismissal procedure and I have asked that parents do not wait near the Braeside Road entrance to the school. This causes a great deal of congestion, so please use the gate near the Year 5 classrooms. It is also very important that children do not arrive at school too early and wait outside the gates. The gates will not be open until 8.15am and supervision will begin at 8.25am.

At the end of last year some significant work was done on our playgrounds. Unfortunately the materials that were used were not satisfactory and so more work has been carried out on levelling areas A and B. Rain also delayed this process and so it has carried on and will hopefully be completed by the end of first term. Area C has also been damaged during the construction of a new cola. This work will also continue over the course of Term 1. Our two new playground areas have been prepared and we are looking at constructing some sails to give some shade to the areas in the future.

Our Opening School Mass will be held on Thursday 18th February at 10.15am. At this Mass we will be presenting our new staff members and school leaders to the community. It is a time for all of us to ask God to be with us and bless all our endeavours in 2016. All parents are welcome to attend.

The Parents and Friends Committee will be holding their first meeting on **Tuesday 23rd February at 7.30pm in the school library**. This is a great opportunity for parents to be involved in the life of the school. The staff car park will be open for the evening and I look forward to lots of parents attending.

You may be aware that Pope Francis has declared a Year of Mercy for 2016. OLQP was started by the Sisters of Mercy in 1957, and we have maintained the Mercy Charism in our Parish. The Pope opened one of the Holy Doors of the Vatican as a symbol of renewal and a celebration of God's grace and mercy.



Safety Around Schools

A Road Safety message from Holroyd City Council

As a new school year begins, it is important to keep road safety on the top of your mind. School Zones can get very busy during drop off and pick up times, it is important for parents and children to remember to take extra care when travelling to and from school. Here are some tips to keep your children safe.




Always obey the parking signs eg. No Stopping, No Parking and Bus Zone

Don't park and block driveways

Don't Double Park when picking up or dropping off Never park on the nature strip or across a footpath

Never park on or near a pedestrian crossing **Parking Safety**



Bike Safety

Children must ALWAYS wear a correctly fitted helmet.

TIP: The helmet should fit low on the forehead so that 2 fingers fit between the helmet and the eyebrows.



Bicycles should be maintained regularly to ensure they are in good working condition.

Children under 12 years old should ride on the footpath.

Bus Safety

Meet your child at the bus stop, NEVER on the opposite side of the road

Wait until the bus has driven away before crossing the road.

Teach your child to stand back from the kerb and away from the traffic.

Remind your child if the bus has seatbelts, they must buckle up.

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
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
