Dear parents, students and teachers,

This was a wonderful opportunity for the children to talk to our Bishop and receive his blessing.



The students at OLQP began the Season of Lent with Ash Wednesday Liturgies in the learning spaces for Kinder to Year 4 and Years 5 & 6 attending the 9.15 am Parish Mass.

Two Year 4 classes were surprised with a visit from Bishop Vincent, who together with Fr Paul presided over the class liturgy and administered ashes on the foreheads of the children.

We were also fortunate to have the Year 12 students from St Paul's College administer the ashes to students as part of the classroom liturgies.

As we journey through the 40 days of Lent (mirroring the 40 days that Jesus spent fasting in the wilderness before starting his ministry), we are asked to participate in the three principles of Lent- pray, do penance and almsgiving.

Each class has a Project Compassion Box in which they are asked to place money in to support Caritas Australia. This year's theme is 100% Hope-Lives Change when we all give 100%
