Dear parents, students and teachers,

We are now in Week 6 of term 3 and the year is moving along at a brisk pace.

Our Kindergarten enrolments for 2020 are complete and we will be having our orientation meeting next term. This year we had a record number of enrolment applications.

Our building project is progressing well. The absence of rain has allowed the foundation work to move along quickly. Over the next few months we should see buildings begin to take shape. We are very grateful to the building company who have supported us in maintaining the children's safety and well-being.

Information about our Fun Run was published and sent home last week. It is an exciting time for the children as we look forward to our colour run around St. Pauls Oval. A number of parents have indicated that Pemulwuy is lacking school buses to get their children to and from school. After significant advocacy, Transit Systems are now finally conducting a full review of bus service demands in Pemulwuy. If changes are to be implemented, the school will be notified, and they will take effect in 2020.

During the week there were two days when the crossing man was off sick. We have been instructed by Cumberland Council that teachers are not to take over this position and use the crossing sign. A teacher may stand on one side of the road and monitor only. In the future we will provide a teacher to supervise in this way.

Dear Parents and Carers

The Catholic Diocese of Parramatta has a plan to significantly expand its provision of childcare services to better support families in western Sydney and the Blue Mountains. This major initiative will serve the local community through the provision of more early childhood education and care services to support local families.

Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) is one of the largest providers of Catholic outof-school-hours care in Sydney and also offers preschool and long day care services. Caring for more than 5,000 children, it provides Before and After School Care centres, 4 Catholic Early Learning Centres, Long Day Care at St Luke's Marsden Park and vacation care programs at 9 centres across western Sydney

A new agency, Catholic Diocese of Parramatta Services Limited, will soon support the growth of early childhood education and care opportunities. Additional services are currently planned across suburbs in need of more out-of-school-hours care places, and long-day care places are also a priority.

This new approach will have minimal impacts on the provision of services to existing clients. With over 300 staff currently employed in these services, the expected growth is also likely to provide more job opportunities for local residents.

I look forward to sharing further information about the work of Catholic Diocese of Parramatta Services Limited in coming months.
